Children in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 took part in an exciting Arabic Art Workshop delivered by **Kinspiration**, where they explored the beauty of traditional Arabic geometric designs. Using colourful shapes, pupils created their own canvas tiles inspired by the decorative patterns often seen in Arabic architecture and buildings. Through this hands-on activity, children learned about repetition, symmetry, colour and shape while developing a greater understanding and appreciation of Arab culture. The workshop provided a fun and engaging way to celebrate cultural diversity, encouraging creativity, curiosity and respect for different traditions.

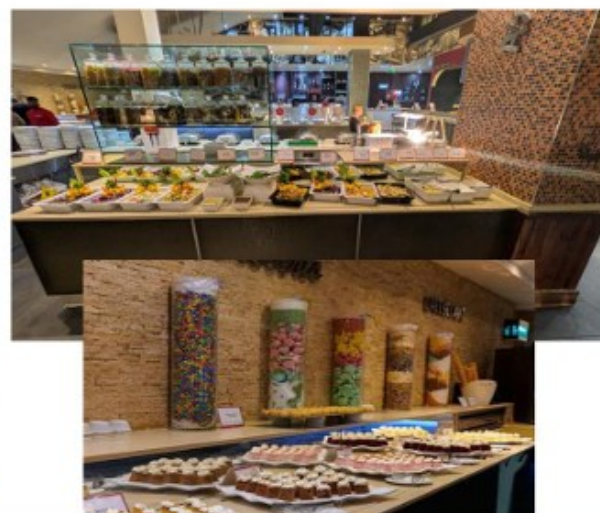
As part of our Arabic Club, we took the children to the **Cleopatra Experience in ExCeL London**. This visit provided an engaging way to explore the history and culture of one of the most significant countries in the Arab world. Egypt has a rich heritage that has influenced Arab civilisation, and today Arabic is the official language spoken by millions of Egyptians.

During the experience, children learnt about the life and legacy of Cleopatra, ancient Egyptian civilisation, and how Egypt has evolved over time. This offered an opportunity to discuss the connection between ancient Egypt and modern Arab identity, introducing children to aspects of Egyptian culture, traditions, and the Arabic language. The visit encouraged curiosity about the diversity of the Arab world while helping pupils make meaningful links between language, history, geography, and culture in an interactive and memorable setting.

The children took part in an engaging VR session, where they explored a variety of locations in Ancient Egypt, bringing history to life through an immersive virtual experience.



The children also enjoyed a meal at Jimmy's World Grill, where they had the opportunity to experience an international buffet offering a wide variety of dishes from around the world, including Middle Eastern and South Asian flavours. This complemented the Arabic Club by allowing pupils to explore foods that are enjoyed across many Arabic-speaking countries, helping them develop a greater appreciation of the region's culture, traditions and hospitality through food.
